Registration: the registration period for the 2020-2021 school year is from Jan 27th to Feb 7th. Again this year, for already existing students whose parents have supplied an e-mail address, registration will be available on-line from February 3rd to 14th. Grade 6 students going to high school next year, you will receive information by e-mail when to register on-line. If your child will not be returning to PEES or continuing on to Galt, you must still go on-line to confirm that he/she will not be returning. **For those students who will be leaving the ETSB, please be sure to print their report cards from the parent portal**.

New students: If you have a child coming to school in the fall for the first time (or know of someone who will be sending their child to school for the first time) please call for an appointment to register (819-843-4847 x 2). The child must be five by September 30th for 5 yr old Kindergarten or four by September 30th for 4 yr old Kindergarten. Be sure to bring the original of your child's birth certificate (the long form), a proof of citizenship of the eligible parent (original long or short form of the birth certificate or a passport) and a proof of residence (driver's license with address or other QC gov't document). It would be helpful if you have the permanent code of the eligible parent also.

<u>New Bilingual Full Time</u>: Starting next year Princess Elizabeth will have a new full time bilingual 4 year old Kindergarten program. The child must be eligible to attend English School and he/she must be 4 years old by September 30th, 2020.

We need a minimum of 6 students to run the program and there is a maximum of 17 students allowed. If we have more than 17 students, the excess will be put on a waiting list. Registration will be on a first come, first served basis as soon as the registration documents are fully complete.

<u>Absences & Late Arrivals</u> - Please phone us at school (819-843-4847) before 8 am in the morning if your child will be late or absent from school. If you child has a specific illness (Gastro, Strep, Scarlet fever, Chicken Pox, etc.), it is important to advise the school. If your child is late, parents will have to enter the school to sign their child(ren) in at the office.

<u>Allergies</u>: Due to severe allergies, we ask that you do not send anything containing nuts, kiwis or seafood to school in lunches. Thank you for keeping our children safe.

<u>Appropriate Clothing</u>: Please ensure that your child(ren) wears appropriate clothing for the changing weather. Snow pants are required. Students are also expected to wear appropriate indoor clothing; two pairs of shoes (one for inside and one for outside). Students must NOT wear outside shoes or boots to classrooms. Due to fire regulations, shoes must be worn at all times.

<u>Healthy Snacks</u> – Please remember students should have a healthy snack in their lunch bags to eat each morning at recess time. For those students who go to Daycare, they should also have a snack to eat after school. Morning and after school snacks are not included when ordering hot lunch.

<u>Illness</u> – It's that time of the year. If your child shows signs of illness, please keep him/her at home until well enough to return to both the regular class and outdoor recess. The student should be fever-free and have not vomited for 24 hours before returning to school. Please see attached a document from the CLSC (in French only) outlining when a child should be kept at home. Thank you for your cooperation.

Parent / Teacher Interviews: will be held on February 12th by request of either the teacher or the parent(s). If you wish to meet with your child(ren)'s teacher, please send a note to his/her teacher.

Parent Portal & Report Cards: Term 2 Report cards will be available on the parent portal on February 11th. To access your child's report card, please login via the quick links on the ETSB or the PEES website. If you have problems, please call Sandy at 819-843-4847 x 2 for help.

PPO Bread Fundraiser: Will be held from Feb. 3rd to 17th to benefit playground improvements. Forms must be returned by February 17th. Delivery should be the week of February 24th. More details to come.

<u>Report cards for grade 6 students</u> requiring copies of report cards for registration, parents can print them directly from the parent portal. If you are having trouble accessing the portal, please contact the school for help.

<u>Snowballs:</u> Please remind your child(ren) that they cannot shoot snow balls at school. This is a safety procedure. Two targets are available for this activity.
